Week 6

Day 1:

Read: John 7:32-39

Reminder: We pick up on the last day of the “Feast of Booths” where people lived in leafy structures to remember God’s faithfulness to Israel during their wilderness wanderings. It was a time of celebration and thanksgiving, and it was two months prior to the “Feast of Dedication” that we will read about in John 10.

1. Where do the Jews think Jesus is going? Where do you think Jesus meant that He was going to go?
 2. Pay close attention to the context that Jesus makes His statement in v. 37-38. Remember they were celebrating God’s faithfulness at the Feast of Booths. Why do you think Jesus chose that moment to proclaim that He alone can give “living water” to those who believe in Him?
 3. What do you think Jesus means when He says “Whoever believes in me, as the Scripture has said, ‘Out of his heart will flow rivers of living water’”?
 - ⊗ Has your heart ever felt dry? What was/is the “water” or sin that you were/are drinking that keeps leaving you dry?
 - ⊗ How does knowing and trusting Jesus bring “living water” that never dries up into your heart? Who specifically lives in us to produce this water?
- ♥ When you are full of the living water of the Holy Spirit, how have you become a source of living water to others in your life?

Day 2:

Read: John 7:40-52

1. What was causing the division among the people? Did they have all the facts about Christ right?
 - a. Where was Jesus’ birthplace? (Matthew 2:1-6)
2. What tends to cause doubt in your heart? Your own opinions and beliefs or Biblical truth?
 - ⊗ How often do you reflect on the truth of God’s Word in a week?
 - ⊗ Does God’s Word bring freedom and clarity or does it cause struggle and confusion in your life? Give reasons for your answer.



- ⊗ Is there a correlation between the amount of time spent studying and reflecting on the truth of God's word and the amount of clarity and joy in your life?
- + What is one truth from God's Word that you have learned this week that you can put into practice every day?

Day 3:

John 7:53-8:11

1. What was the motivation of the Pharisees to bring the woman to Jesus?
2. How do you think the woman felt in that moment? Have you ever felt like the woman because of choices you have made?
3. Why didn't any of the men choose to throw a stone at her? Is anyone ever sinless to the point of being able to throw a stone at someone else who has sinned? (Romans 3:10-12, Romans 3:23).
4. The Pharisees were trying to use the law to disprove Christ's message of forgiveness. According to Romans 7, the law was given to reveal our imperfection up against the perfect law of God. So when Jesus stated, "let He who is without sin cast the first stone," no one threw a stone because the law reveals their guilt just as it did the woman's.
 - ⊗ What can we learn about the heart of God by seeing how Jesus responds to the woman?
 - ♥ What do we learn about how to love others by what we see in Jesus' interactions with her?
 - a. Who can you relate to the most in this passage, the woman or the Pharisees? What are some beliefs that you need to repent of today?

Day 4:

John 8:12-30

1. Where is Jesus going that the Pharisees cannot go? Why can't they go there?
2. What is Jesus saying about Himself in this passage? What is the consequence of not believing in Christ?
3. Jesus uses the analogy of darkness a lot to describe Himself as "the light". What does walking in darkness practically look like on this earth? What are some dark places that you still walk in today?
4. If walking in the light is an action, what are the choices we need to make in order to walk in the light?
 - a. What choices are you making right now? Are they choices to walk in darkness or light?



Day 5:

John 8:31-38

1. What is evidence of being Jesus' disciple according to this passage?
2. What is the result of knowing the truth from God's Word?
- ⊗ Do you feel free right now? Are there any areas of your life where you feel like a slave to sin?
 - ⊗ In the areas where you still feel like a slave, what are the thoughts and beliefs that you have about that sin area?
 - a. What does God's Word say about that area of sin?
 - b. What choices based on truth are you going to make this week to begin to find the freedom Jesus promises us?

Day 6:

John 8:39-59

- ⊗ What are the verses in this passage where Jesus reveals His equality to God?
1. Why did the Pharisees have a hard time with Jesus claims?
 - a. Why couldn't they believe in the claims He was making?
2. Who did Jesus say was their father? Was the devil their literal father?
 - a. What was the evidence that the devil was their father?
 - b. If we do not believe in Christ, does that mean we are also children of the devil?
 - i. Read Ephesians 2:1-3 for help with this question.
 - ii. Can anyone be neutral in this world? (Meaning not with God or with the devil.)
- + Whose kingdom do you want to live for and advance, Jesus' or the devil's? How are you going to intentionally impact the kingdom of God in your life this week?
